PROFILE



Custom clearance of cargo at ports was handled by three kinds of people who were regulated by the customs. Dalal or 'pass writer' was the oldest known category, predating even the establishment of the Bombay Port Trust in1873 and the enactment of the Customs Act in 1878. Dalals were responsible for preparing documents at the customs. The first known dalal was said to be Dosabhoy Mistry who secured a licence to transact business as far back as in 1858, the year East India Company made its exit from the country. Muccadams were another kind of people engaged in the physical handling of cargo at the docks and had no authority to process documents through Customs. The firm Curumsey Damji was said to be functioning as Muccadams around 1858. The third kind of people emerged towards the end of the eighteenth century. They were clearing agents licensed by the Sea Customs Act, 1878. They could assume the activities of both the Dalals and Muccadams and they also had the added authority of signing documents on behalf of merchants

In 1960, with the New Custom Brokers Licensing Rules with modifications to the then existing CHA Licensing Rules 1957 were notified. A need for a joint representation to the Government and common action was felt. Accordingly a joint conference of all Clearing Agents Associations In India was called. On 9th July, 1960 a meeting of Clearing Agents Association of Bombay, Calcutta, Madras, Cochin and the Karachiwala Association was held in Mumbai. It was during this meeting that it was resolved to form a federation of all the customs clearing agents associations in India. On 2nd December, 1962, former Union Minister of Finance Late. Shri Morarjee Desai inaugurated the Federation Of Customs Clearing Agents Associations Of India (now, Federation Of Freight Forwarders Associations' In India). The Bombay, Calcutta, Cochin, Jamnagar, Goa, Kandla and Bhavnagar Associations formed the Federation.








TRANSPORT OBLIGATIONS, COSTS AND RISKS

A Glossary of International Shipping Terms

Air waybill (AWB)

The AWB is a document that controls the routing of an exporter's cargo while it is in the hands of the air carrier or a consolidator. It is a contract for carriage; however, it cannot be negotiated.

Apparent good order

When freight appears to be free of damage after being assessed it is said to be in apparent good order.

Beneficiary

The party that receives payment.

Bilateral

A bilateral agreement is one in which both parties agree to provide something for the other

Bill of lading

A document issued by a carrier or their agent acknowledging receipt of cargo for shipment. Often abbreviated as BOL, BoL, B/L or BL. If there were no issues with the cargo stated on the BOL, it is said to be **a clean bill of lading**.

Blocking or bracing

Wood or metal supports used to secure cargo while in transit. Also called dunnage.

Bulk cargo

Cargo that is shipped loose as opposed to being shipped in packages or containers. Grain and coal are examples of goods usually shipped as bulk cargo.

Cargo manifest

A document detailing the cargo carried on a ship, often provided to a customs authority.

Carrier

A carrier is a party that transports goods for another person or company and is responsible for any possible loss of or damage to the goods during transport. A common carrier provides transportation services to the public in return for compensation. A contract carrier provides this service under special contracts, often for government clients.

Certificate of origin (COO)

A document certifying where goods were originally made. A COO specific to a particular

free trade agreement may be used to claim preferential duty treatment. A generic certificate of origin may be requested by the customs authority of the country of import, in which case the COO must be stamped by a chamber of commerce.

Chamber of commerce

An association of businesses that may serve several functions, including advocating or lobbying for their member companies, organizing business-related programming and events in their communities, and, perhaps most relevant for exporters, providing document certification services

Container manifest

A document stating the contents of a container, its point of origin and point of destination. Vessels may be required by law to produce a manifest for every container being transported.

Dangerous goods

A product may be considered a dangerous good if it is corrosive, flammable, poisonous, toxic, explosive, etc. Shipping dangerous goods may require special documentation or packaging to ensure safety.

Demurrage/detention

Demurrage is a charge to be paid by a shipper or consignee to the carrier as penalty for delaying the carrier's container beyond the allowed free time.

Embargoes

Sanctions are prohibitions designed to protect economic or national security and may include trade barriers, tariffs and restrictions on financial transactions. Embargoes are similar but usually refer to more severe restrictions such as travel bans or blockades.

Endorsement

A legal signature that signals transfer of rights from one party to another.

Force majeure

A common clause included in contracts that exempts parties for not fulfilling their obligations due to events beyond their control, such as natural disasters or war.

Free time

The amount of time that a carrier's equipment may be used without incurring additional charges.

FTA

Free trade agreements are made between countries in an effort to reduce barriers to trade between the participating countries.

HS

The Harmonized System is an internationally accepted system used to classify products. The first six digits of an HS code are universal across all countries, but each country will add additional digits to further specify products. HS codes play a role in determining import and export controls as well as duty rates. The code for a particular product is often called its tariff classification, as is the process for finding the right code.

Intermodal

Intermodal transportation is the movement of goods via more than one type of transportation (e.g. air, rail, sea, truck, etc.). An intermodal container is one that can be used in different modes of transport without having to unload the goods and reload them at each point at which the mode of transport changes. In the context of international trade, intermodal container is usually synonymous with container.

Letter of credit

Also called a documentary collection and often abbreviated as LC or L/C, a letter of credit is a written commitment by a bank issued after a request by an importer that payment will be made to an exporter provided that the terms of the letter of credit have been met as evidenced by the presentation of certain documents.

Negotiable/non-negotiable

A negotiable instrument is a document that can be transferred from its original holder to a third party. A non-negotiable document cannot be transferred to another party. An inland or ocean bill of lading may be either negotiable or non-negotiable; a bill of lading consigned "to order" or "to order of shipper" is negotiable once it is endorsed on the back by the shipper or their representative. Airwaybills are always non-negotiable.

Transshipment

The transfer of cargo from one carrier to another or from one vehicle to another at an intermediate point during the goods' journey to the final destination.

Vessel manifest

A document listing details regarding the crew and cargo onboard a vessel.

National Waterway-1

The Ganga - Bhagirathi - Hooghly river system between Haldia (Sagar) and Allahabad (1620 km) was declared as National Waterway-1 (NW-1) in 1986. Since then IWAI is carrying out various developmental works on the waterway for improvement of its navigability and also development and maintenance of other infrastructure such as navigation aids and terminal facilities as laid down in the IWAI Act, 1985 (82 of 1985). During 2017-18, the important works carried out for development and maintenance of fairway, navigational aids and terminal facilities on NW-1 are as below:

National Waterway-2

The river Brahmaputra having a length of 891 Km between Bangladesh Border and Sadiya was declared as National Waterway no. 2 (NW-2) on 1st September, 1988. IWAI is carrying out various developmental works on the waterway for improving its navigability as laid down in the IWAI act. 1985 (82 of 1985).

As per IWAI, Act 1985, IWAI is responsible to develop the waterway for navigation. IWAI is maintaining a navigable depth of 2.5m in B'Border- Neamati (629 Km), 2.0 m in Neamati – Dibrugarh (139 Km) and 1.5m in Dibrugarh – Sadiya (Oriumghat) stretch. At present the waterway is being used by vessels of Govt. of Assam, Army Border Security Forces, Tourism organization and other private operators. Long cruise tourist vessels are making voyages between Pandu and Majuli island near Neamah regularly. From October to May, over dimensional cargo (ODC) is also transported through the waterway from time to time.

To maintain LAD of 2 m in the Brahmani river all through the year, 5 barrages with height equal to the highest flood level are proposed to be constructed at every 26 km between Talcher and Jokadia. Each barrage will have a navigational lock to allow passage of two 500 tonne vessels at a time.

Cargo potential

Coal from Talcher to Dhamra and Paradip ports is the most important potential cargo for this waterway. Immediately after the development of the waterway, it is estimated in the DPR that about 11 million tonne of cargo can be transported per year which can go up to 23 million tonne in next 15 years or so.

Federation of Freight Forwarders' Associations In India (Apex Body of Customs Brokers' Associations)



STANDARD TRADING CONDITIONS FOR FREIGHT FORWARDERS

These are the Standard Trading Conditions applicable to the members of the Federation of Freight Forwarders' Associations in India. These conditions do not apply when the forwarders acts as a carrier or a combined transport operator.

1. Definitions:

A freight forwarder (hereinafter called FORWARDER) is one who undertakes as a licensed Customs Broker, Customs Clearance and Forwarding of goods on behalf of his customer, including if necessary, procurement and coordination of one or more modes of transport. He may also undertake to perform more modes of transport. He may also undertake to perform other functions connected with the main contract such as warehousing (including storage in transit) groupage or consolidation, packing, documentation, weighing and measurement of cargo container leasing, insurance, foreign exchange transaction etc.

In case he is required to be licensed or approved by the Government or other Public Authorities for the performance of any of his functions, the term "Freight Forwarder" would mean only such licensed or approved persons.

2. Performance of the Contract:

- (a) The Forwarder shall perform his duty with diligence and shall take care of the goods entrusted to him as a man of ordinary prudence thereby protecting the interest of his customers. In the event of the Forwarder agent takes the care of the goods entrusted to him as a man of ordinary prudence he shall not be held responsible for any loss or damages that may be suffered by the goods entrusted to him.
- (b) A customer shall give the Forwarder such instructions as are necessary for the performance of the contract and the latter shall abide by these instructions in a manner suited to the requirement of the customer. If however, the Forwarder is satisfied, at any stage, that a departure from those instructions is justified in the interest of the customer, he shall be at liberty to act accordingly. The Forwarder is not in a position to guarantee a firm date in regard to the arrival of the goods at destination. In the absence of any specific instructions issued by the customer, the Forwarder is free to exercise his discretion in the choice of sub-contractors, modes of transport and transportation routes. Provided further that in the absence of any specific instructions in writing the Forwarder shall be at liberty to exercise his own judgement for the delivery of the goods and for transport of the goods as a man of ordinary prudence.

- (c) Customer shall advance such sums as may be required by the Forwarders for meeting disbursements on account of the customer. When the Forwarder acts only as a Customs Broker he is governed by Customs Broker Licensing Regulations 2013. The Customer will make available to the Forwarder all documents, information etc., as required. The Forwarder shall exercise all due care within the Regulations. In the event the Forwarder takes all care under the Regulations he shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage or delay.
- (d) It is understood and accepted as well as certified by the Customer that the Forwarder acting as Customs Broker is not privy to any dealings prior to and post the process of Customs Clearance.
- (e) The Forwarder is not responsible for effecting cargo insurance but may arrange such insurance, if so instructed by the Customer. In such cases, cargo insurance will be arranged by the Forwarder on account of the customer, on such terms and conditions as may be acceptable to the insurers.

3. Liability of the Freight Forwarder:

- (a) The Forwarder is liable only for his own faults attributable to himself or his employees
- (b) The Forwarder shall not be liable to the customer for consequential loss or loss of market howsoever caused.
- (c) The Forwarder shall not be liable for acts or omission of third parties such as reforwarders, carrier etc., provided he has shown due diligence in the choice of such third parties. If it can be proved that he has not done so his liability shall not exceed that of any third party held liable, whom he had contracted with.
- (d) The liability of the Forwarder for loss of or damage to goods will be fixed on the basis of the market value of the goods at the time of acceptance by the freight forwarder and will not, under any circumstances, exceed that market value or a sum at the rate of Rs. 15/- per kilo of the gross weight of the goods lost or damaged, whichever is less subject to a maximum of Rs. 15,000/- for each occurrence of loss.
- (e) The Forwarder may arrange/ provide Road Transport for customer and in such event the Forwarder shall not be held responsible as a carrier or assume the liability of a carrier. The Forwarder when working as a Custom Broker shall not be liable for any consequences arising out of actions of Custodians, Carriers, Customs and any other statutory or Regulatory Departments or Agencies.
 - (f) In the event of the liability of the Forwarder being sought to be varied, the variation shall only be affected by a written document signed by the Forwarder; in the absence of such a document the liability of the Forwarder shall be governed as provided herein.

4. Right to lien and detention:

- (a) Constituents shall pay the bills presented by the Forwarder within 15 days of their presentation, failing which penal interest at 3% above Bank's lending unless specifically agreed to that contrary rate of interest shall become due and payable from due date or 15 days as applicable.
- (b) The Forwarder has a right to lien and a right of detention over the goods or other securities and effects lying within his power of disposal in respect of any amount whether already due for payment or not which the Forwarder is entitled to receive in respect of services to the customer. In exercise of the lien under this clause, the Forwarder shall be entitled to dispose of the goods, either by public or private sales upon which lien is exercised, to recover his dues, provided that he gives a written notice of at least 7 days to the customer of his intention to do so. The Forwarder is entitled to recover all the balance amount from the customer after recovery of the dues by the sale of the goods under this clause and the right exercised by Forwarder under this clause shall not be deemed to have been waiver of his right to take further legal steps to recover the dues.

5 Time Limit:

Claims against the Forwarder shall be time barred within a period of one year commencing from the day of delivery of the goods to the consignee named in the contract or, out of charge from Customs or if no delivery has taken place, from the date of the conclusion of the Forwarding contract.

6. Jurisdiction:

Unless expressly agreed to the contrary, claims against the Forwarder shall be decided at the principal place of his business. All the juridical relations between the Forwarder, the customer or authorized persons shall together with the application of these conditions, be regulated by Indian law.

7. Arbitration:

Any dispute between the Forwarder and the customer arising in connection with the performance of the contract shall be settled in accordance with the provision of the Indian Arbitration Act at the principal place of business of the Forwarder, each party appointing an arbitrator and the two arbitrators, in the event of disagreement appointing an umpire whose decision shall be final and binding upon both parties provided the arbitrators to be appointed under this clause shall be appointed only from the panel of arbitrators duly approved by FFFAI.

In case the Forwarder has to undertake warehousing of the goods, the conditions applicable will be as laid down in the Document, finalized by FFFAI and Indian Bank's Association in September 1979.

What is freight forwarding? What do forwarders do?

FIATA adopted and published the following definition in 2004:

Freight forwarding and logistics services

"Freight forwarding and logistic services" means services of any kind relating to the carriage (performed by single mode or multimodal transport means), consolidation, storage, handling, packing or distribution of goods, as well as ancillary and advisory services in connection therewith, including but not limited to customs and fiscal matters, declaring the goods for official purposes, procuring insurance of the goods and collecting or procuring payment or documents relating to the goods. Freight forwarding services also include logistic services with modern information and communication technology in connection with the carriage, handling or storage of the goods, and de facto total supply chain management. These services can be tailored to meet the flexible application of the services provided.

Freight forwarding is all about the facilitation of international trade. The freight forwarder is the party who ensures that internationally traded goods move from point of origin to point of destination to arrive:

- at the right place
- at the right time
- in good condition
- at the most economical cost

To accomplish this, expertise is required in a number of different areas:

Logistics

Close cooperation is required with transporters in every mode – road, rail, sea and air. Freight forwarders are constantly negotiating freight rates and service conditions with transport providers, comparing the costs of moving cargo along different routes via different modes and then designing logistics service chains, which provide the best compromise between cost, speed and reliability.

Regulatory compliance

A vital ingredient to successfully trading between world markets is that every transaction must comply with many regulatory measures and requirements, sometimes carrying fairly complex procedures, especially those associated with customs and security. In the area of regulatory compliance, the specialised skills and knowledge of the freight forwarder come to the fore. Traders who avail themselves of the service of skilled freight forwarders find the assistance they need to make their trade efficient, secure and compliant.

Risk management

To every international trade transaction, there is an element of risk and the increased complexity of international trading as compared to local buying and selling requires that these risks are managed with tools which are correspondingly more sophisticated. International traders require that their forwarders be in position to advise and assist them in minimising those risks which are particularly associated with the movement of goods – loss, damage and destruction, although the exposure of forwarders to the international environment in its entirety makes their counsel as regards matters like credit and currency risks very much sought after.

Finance and payment

Forwarders are entrusted with goods which are often dispatched under conditions where buyer and seller are not known to one another. Under these circumstances, the forwarder must scrupulously ensure that all requirements of the door-to-door operation are fully complied with, especially where the accurate and timely production of documentation is concerned —. Excellence in this field leads to prompt settlement for goods purchased, and satisfied traders. An especially gratifying aspect of freight forwarding is the facilitation, through consultancy and networking, of the entry of new exporters and importers into new markets. More often than not, this involves advice as to alternative methods of financing for the transactions concerned and the establishment of payment methods that are mutually beneficial to both parties.

Cross functional integration

The forwarder is ideally placed to act as the catalyst to maximise the benefit from advances in information technology which are revolutionising modern traders' processes. Furthermore, the role of the forwarder will be key because, in adopting cross functional integration strategies, companies are increasingly outsourcing their non-core activities. The ability to ensure the efficient and effective door-to-door movement of goods from country to country, from the time an order is placed until finished goods are delivered to the intended consignee, places the freight forwarder in a position to make a unique contribution to the enhancement of the value of the traded goods.

PM Gati Shakti- National Master Plan for Multi Modal connectivity to various Economic Zones

PM GatiShakti National Master Plan (PMGS-NMP) was launched on 13th October 2021 for providing multimodal connectivity infrastructure to various economic zones. Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) accorded approval for the implementation of PM GatiShakti National Master Plan on 21st October 2021.

PM GatiShakti is a transformative approach for economic growth and sustainable development. The approach is driven by 7 engines, namely:

- Railways
- 2. Roads
- Ports
- 4 Waterways
- Airports
- Mass Transport
 Logistics Infrastructure

All 7 engines will pull forward the economy in unison. These engines are supported by the complementary roles of Energy Transmission, IT Communication, Bulk Water & Sewerage, and Social Infrastructure. The approach is powered by Clean Energy and Sabka Prayas — the efforts of the Central Government, the state governments, and the private sector together — leading to huge job and entrepreneurial opportunities for all, especially the youth.

The scope of PM GatiShakti National Master Plan will encompass the 7 engines for economic transformation, seamless multimodal connectivity and logistics efficiency. It will also include the infrastructure developed by the State Governments, as per the GatiShakti Master Plan. The focus will be on planning, financing including through innovative ways, use of technology and speedier implementation.

The projects pertaining to these 7 engines in the "National Infrastructure Pipeline" will be aligned with PM GatiShakti framework. The touchstone of the Master Plan will be world-class modern infrastructure and logistics synergy among different modes of movement — both of people and goods — and location of projects. This will help raise productivity and accelerate economic growth and development.

The plan has been developed as a Digital Master Planning tool by BISAG-N (Bhaskaracharya National Institute for Space Applications and Geoinformatics) and has been prepared in dynamic Geographic Information System (GIS) platform wherein data on specific action plan of all the Ministries/ Departments have been incorporated within a comprehensive database. Dynamic mapping of all infrastructure projects with real-time updation will be provided by way of a map developed by BISAG-N. The map will be built on open-source technologies and hosted securely on MEGHRAJ i.e. cloud of Govt. of India. It will use satellite imagery available from ISRO and base maps from Survey of India. The comprehensive database of the ongoing & future projects of various Ministries has been integrated with 200+ GIS layers thereby facilitating planning, designing and execution of the infrastructure projects with a common vision.

The digital system is a software where individual Ministries will be given separate user identification (login ids) to update their data on a periodic basis. The data of all the individual Ministries will be integrated in one platform which will be available for planning, review and monitoring. The Logistics Division, Ministry of Commerce & Industry (MOCI) will further assist all the stakeholders through BISAG-N for creating and updating their required layers in the system and update their database through Application Programming Interface (APIs).









